MASTIC REMOVAL OPERATION: APPLICATION OF MASTIC REMOVAL SOLVENT EMULSION FOR THE REMOVAL OF FLOOR TILE MASTIC AT VARIOUS ASBESTOS ABATEMENT SITES.

Every person who owns or operates this equipment is required to comply with the conditions listed below and all applicable requirements and District rules, including but not limited to Rules 10, 20, 40, 50, 51.

FAILURE TO OPERATE IN COMPLIANCE IS A MISDEMEANOR SUBJECT TO CIVIL AND CRIMINAL PENALTIES

1. This portable mastic removal operation shall be operated only at stationary sources which have aggregate actual emissions of less than 25 tons per year of volatile organic compounds (VOC) or have aggregate potential to emit of less than 50 tons per year of VOCs. (Rule 20.4)
2. The permittee shall only use asbestos mastic removal solvents listed in Attachment DD for asbestos mastic removal operations.
3. Usage of mastic removal solvents shall not exceed 3,750 gallons per consecutive 12 month period (Rule 20.4)

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4. This portable mastic removal operation shall not be used simultaneously at different stationary sources unless a separate Permit to Operate is obtained from the District. (Rule 21)
5. Prior to using materials containing volatile organic compounds (VOC), the permittee shall verify with the stationary source that voc emissions from this emission unit shall not exceed any applicable VOC emission limit.
6. Prior to operation of this equipment at any location within San Diego County, the Air Pollution Control District Compliance Division shall be informed in writing within two days of the specific location (including the address) of operation.
7. The Compliance Division shall be supplied with the name and phone number of the person responsible for supervising operation of this equipment located at the processing site.
8. Daily or monthly usage records shall include:
Usage of material containing volatile organic compounds and date solvents are applied.
Address of the site undergoing asbestos abatement.
A copy of these records shall be provided to the stationary source at the end of the work day to allow for a facility-wide determination.

9. Permittee shall maintain purchase records and daily or monthly records of the material(s) used in the above operation and the date and locations at which the operation was conducted. These records shall be maintained onsite and shall be made available to the District upon request. Records shall be kept for at least three years at a central location. (Rule 21)
10. If monthly records are maintained, the number of operating days per calendar month shall be recorded. (Rule 20)
11. Permittee shall maintain current material safety data sheets (MSDS) on-site and made readily available to the District upon request. The MSDS shall identify the following for all material containing volatile organic compounds (per Rule 2) used in this operation above. Rule 20.4
12. All solvents, materials containing solvents and other materials containing organic compounds shall be stored



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in closed containers in accordance with Rule 67.17 requirements.

13. Access, facilities, utilities and any necessary safety equipment for source testing and inspection shall be provided upon request of the Air Pollution Control District.
14. This Air Pollution Control District Permit does not relieve the holder from obtaining permits or authorizations required by other governmental agencies.
15. The permittee shall, upon determination of applicability and written notification by the District, comply with all applicable requirements of the Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Information and Assessment Act (California Health and Safety Code Section 44300 et seq.)
